GLP Courses (4 days/week)

Each participant will take four topics courses of their choosing every 7 weeks, each with the aim of improving global competency and English proficiency through informative seminars and lively discussion with their peers. Topics may include public policy, economy, politics, education, culture, presentation skills, and leadership.

Global Leadership Seminars (bi-weekly)

Guest speakers present current issues and topics related to global leadership to enhance GLP participants' awareness around the globe and their global competencies.

Professional Site Visits (bi-weekly)

The Asian Affairs Center will organize site visits and field trips to enhance the immersive experience for the scholars.

Conversation Partners (optional component)

If you are interested, we can match you with an American conversation partner who you can meet with outside of class times to enhance your understanding of American culture and practice your English with a native speaker.

Accent & Pronunciation Modification (optional component)

Participants may choose to attend two-on-one sessions with an MU graduate specialist in the Department of Speech, Language and Hearing Sciences. This highquality program is designed to improve pronunciation of spoken English.

Family Involvement Programs (optional components)

Spouses or significant others of participants have access to specialized group classes to help them integrate into the community and learn about American culture. Dependent children will be able to participate in our online Junior Leaders Program with local children and children from other countries, for an additional fee.

PROFESSIONAL/GOVERNMENT TRACK

Professional Practicum (optional component)

Participants may sign up for a professional practicum/internship at a Missouri state agency or nonprofit that suits their professional interests.

ACADEMIC / RESEARCH TRACK

Research Project (optional component)

Scholars will receive guidance for their research, including connections with specialists in their field, journal publication resources, and information on conferences.

For each 7-week session, scholars will choose 4 classes, each of which meets twice a week. We provide <u>informative</u>, <u>interactive courses</u> on a variety of topics. Our courses are designated as Beginning, Intermediate 1, Intermediate 2, and Advanced. Prior to your admission, you will be evaluated to help us determine the level that most closely corresponds to your current level of English. Class offerings vary each session.

Dynamic guest speakers will present on current issues and topics of interest. Participants will gain a deeper understanding of worldwide topics and sharpen their global leadership competencies.


Application Deadline

For Spring Programs:	First application deadline: Sept. 1 (decision by Sept. 15) Second application deadline: Nov. 1 (decision by Nov. 15)
For Fall Programs:	First application deadline: Feb. 1 (decision by Feb. 15) Second application deadline: April 1 (decision by April 15)

Classes typically begin in mid-January and mid-August, with a 6-week winter break and an 8-week summer break.
